



1. Uzès Medieval Garden and towers, labelled a 'Jardin Remarquable' (remarkable garden)

The 12th-century Medieval Garden can be found at the heart of the old town of Uzès and was granted the 'Remarkable Garden' label in December 2024. It was given a makeover in 1995 and is inspired by monastic gardens and hortus conclusus from the Middle Ages. The flower beds are presented according to different themes and there are 400 or so plant species that reflect medieval horticultural and medicinal practices, for a botanical journey back in time. The gardens are overlooked by the Towers of the King and Bishop and visitors enjoy the exceptional panoramic view of Uzès after climbing the 100 steps to the top, as well as the many cultural events held here throughout the year.


4. Leonardo da Vinci Garden at the Château de Bosc

Pont Du Gard

Built in the middle of the 1st century AD by the Romans and listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1985, the Pont du Gard is the most majestic part of an almost 50-km-long aqueduct that carried water to Nîmes from the Eure valley spring in Uzès. It is the tallest and one of the best preserved Roman aqueducts in the world.



he Pont du Gard site is a 165-hectare playground for visitors. A museum, a cinema, a recreational area and various temporary exhibitions take visitors on a voyage back in time! The open-air 'Memories of the Garrigue' trail invites you to discover the history of the Mediterranean landscape, the local land and the remains of the aqueduct.


Join a guided tour to the top of the aqueduct, for a truly thrilling experience you'll never forget, 49 metres above the ground. Uzès. 1st Duchy of France

s a designated 'Town of Art & History', Uzès is instantly recognisable by its unique silhouette. The private mansions, the Saint-Théodorit Cathedral with its intricate bell tower, the Duchy buildings overlooking the old town, the *Place aux Herbes* and its covered walkways make Uzès a must-see attraction in Gard and give it a Tuscany feel.

In 2024, the town gained international recognition when it was ranked 7th in the world's most welcoming towns, according to verified reviews on Booking.com. This recent success for the town can be put down to its rebirth that began in 1965 when, thanks to the Malraux law, it became a listed zone. This exceptional heritage with fascinating cultural scene and history, can be explored all year round thanks to the 'Rendez-Vous Uzès' programme of guided tours and cultural activities

Restored wall walk at Lussan

Lussan, listed among the Most Beautiful Villages in France, has recently restored the rampart walk around the top of its castle. The two-hour guided tour takes you through the history of this village as you visit the 15th-century castle and enjoy the superb panoramic view from the wall walk. Castillon-du-Gard, medieval treasure with the 'Petite Cité de Caractère' label Castillon-du-Gard looks down across the famous Pont du Gard from a rocky overhang. The cobbled streets, timeless chapels and historic gargoyles whisk us back to the Middle Ages. The panoramic view of Gardon valley and the Pont du Gard reflects the perfect harmony between nature and heritage. The village has been awarded the 'Petite Cité de Caractère®' (charming little village) label, and its remarkable heritage sites are showcased, offering visitors a top-quality experience.

Meynes, a village with plenty of curiosities

The medieval village of Meynes is perched up above Gardon valley, andboastsafascinating, authentichistory. The parish church is decorated with some remarkable paintings, and is home to a 5th- or 6th-century altarpiece, which is among the oldest Christian monuments in the region. Meynes is also well-known for its traditional pottery, and has had up to thirteen pottery kilns and brickworks over the years. Its waters with healing properties were popular with Charlemagne and Francis I, adding a legendary historic touch to this village's history.

aint-Quentin-la-Poterie has a rich tradition for pottery dating back to the 14th century and enjoys a great reputation in the world of ceramics. Initially, this expertise was devoted to making pottery for culinary use, but was then developed over time to produce more delicate pieces. In the Middle Ages, the village supplied decorative tiles for the Palace of the Popes in Avignon!

Today, around forty pottery and ceramics workshops bring new life to the village's narrow streets lined with colourful houses. They organise classes and tours and reflect the 'Arts & Crafts City' label that was awarded to the village in 1992. The Terra Viva gallery exhibits works by the greatest ceramics artists and since 1998, the Museum of Mediterranean Pottery has showcased its collection of several hundred pieces dating from the 18th century to the present day. Every year in July, the village springs to life to celebrate this living heritage with the European ceramic arts festival, Terralha

1. David Jamin Gallery

The David Jamin gallery/workshop is in the centre of Uzès' old town, and is where all the artist's works of art were created, including his famous 'Introportraits', before they then went on to shine in galleries across France and overseas. This gallery/workshop is a family-oriented business and now also displays drawings by his daughter, Lola Jamin. Having decided to follow in her father's footsteps, Lola is now launching her own career as an artist.

he black truffle, or Tuber Melanosporum, from Pays d'Uzès Pont du Gard is one of the iconic treasures of French gastronomy. It is a star among the culinary delights of Gard and is reputed across the country. From mid-December to March, this black diamond is harvested from the limestone soils of Uzège, and used to add a special touch to dishes concocted by local producers and at the region's fine-dining restaurants. www.uzes-pontdugard.com/en/destination/gourmande



he destination is fortunate to be located in a region renowned for its exceptional wine-growing conditions. The climate, clay-limestone soils and different grape varieties are ideal for the production of wines that are grouped into several official appellations: AOC Côtes du Rhône, AOC Côtes du Rhône Villages, Signargues, PDO Costières de Nîmes, PDO Duché d'Uzès, PGI Côteaux du Pont du Gard and PGI Cévennes. Grape varieties cultivated in the local vineyards include Viognier, Grenache, Syrah, Cinsault, Roussanne, Marsanne and Chardonnay. These wines are the perfect accompaniment to local cuisine.

As an aperitif, they are generally served with the emblematic olive that you can find at every local market and in all its forms. In particular, the picholine which is a crunchy olive with juicy flesh. This is the star variety that is used in Nîmes AOP Olive Oil. Harvested in early autumn, it is still prepared today using the traditional 'à la Picholine' recipe developed by the Picholini brothers in the 18th century.



1. Truffle Festival

Every year, on the third weekend in January, the Truffle Festival celebrates the black diamond with a range of events including sales of truffles and fungus-type plants, *cavage* displays (truffle hunting with dogs), lectures, festivities, and above all, tastings!



he Gardon Gorges form a 29-km canyon between Dions in the west and the Pont du Gard to the east. A symbolic example of landscapes carved out of limestone rock, the canyon alternates between arid plateaus of garrigue scrubland, deep gorges of up to 120 metres, rock faces and caves. This exceptional site has been recognised and enhanced by several labels: Listed Natural Site since 1982, Regional Nature Reserve, Natura 2000 Special Conservation Area, Grand Site de France and designated as a Biosphere Reserve by UNESCO in 2015!

This breathtaking landscape is home to a rich heritage dating back to prehistoric times with the Bayol Cave at Collias. The delightful hermitage of Saint-Vérédème at La Baume in Sanilhac-Sagriès bears witness to medieval life while various dry-stone buildings are evidence of an uninterrupted human presence at the site.





2. Fauna & Flora

The Gardon Gorges are home to an exceptional and well preserved ecosystem. Renowned for the beauty of their landscapes, they are also appreciated for their variety of fauna and flora. The site's management and facilitation activities are coordinated by the Syndicat Mixte des Gorges du Gardon, a mixed association that strives for the preservation of this region which is home to some charismatic species. With a little discretion, visitors might spot the Bonelli's eagle, the Egyptian vulture, the short-toed snake eagle, the Eurasian beaver and various bats.

3. Eco-players

In 2017, the Syndicat Mixte des Gorges du Gardon created a network of committed eco-players. They carry out their activities in the biosphere reserve, with a commitment to protecting this lively and inviting region! A number of Destination UP partners are involved in the approach: Trek Evasion, Chemins Maqiques, 2 Ô-Outdoor, Canoë Le Tourbillon, Puravida, Jardin Médiéval, Tiers-Lieu le 21 and Domaine de Malaïque.





Hiking is not only a great way to exercise, it's also an opportunity to embrace the destination's culture and heritage features. To help visitors make such discoveries, a number of marked-out routes are available, including interpretive trails suitable for children, long-distance GR trails and the Urbain V trail. To find all the destination's hiking possibilities, simply visit one of the tourist information outlets in Remoulins or Uzès and ask for the quidemap.

Wisiting and local cyclists can make the most of the Pont du Gard greenway and its many loop itineraries that take you exploring the region.

Between Aramon and Montfrin, the Via Rhôna on the Avignon - Beaucaire section (37.7km) takes you through beautiful countryside and connects with local cycle paths.



Uzès Exhibition IV: Plunge into the world of maritime art

Uzès, 1st Duchy of France and a designated 'Town of Art and History', has been hosting major exhibitions for the past four years in the former bishop's palace, a remarkable heritage site. In 2024, the exhibition devoted to the Bugatti family's never-before-seen artworks and paintings by Adolphe Monticelli attracted more than 15,000 visitors.

This year, the fourth annual event is sure to be just as fascinating as the previous ones, with an exceptional collection of 70 or so watercolours on display from 1st May to 26th October 2025. These artworks are from the prestigious Roux dynasty, the first marine portrait artists from the 18th and 19th centuries, offering a unique insight into maritime life back then with great technical accuracy and fascinating historic details. An unmissable cultural event for fans of art and maritime history.


